5.	<b>Business Arising:</b> There were no matters arising		

6.	<p><b>Company reports including environmental monitoring:</b></p> <p>PH reported on what had been a remarkable period. The summer of drought, fires and smoke made environmental monitoring complex. The air monitoring systems were compromised by the intense smoke and consequently dust monitoring was undertaken and reported on but the effect of the smoke was obvious. The 10 dust monitors had to be set to differentiate between smoke and dust.</p> <p>All environmental monitoring is as per the consent orders and all reports are available on the Quarry website.</p> <p>PH agreed to brief the committee on dust monitoring at the next meeting</p>	PH	Next meeting
7.	<p><b>Matters raised by Community Representatives</b></p> <p>MZ raised the matter of blasting. It was reported through the Jerrabomberra Residents Assoc that a blast had occurred around midday last Tuesday. PH reported that a blast had occurred at that time and it may have been more apparent to residents as the blast was on an upper tier of the quarry and therefore more likely to be heard from a distance. Lack of normal traffic noise was also a factor. PH agreed to work with JRA to let them know in advance of blasting the details of which can be posted on the JRA website. Generally blasting is well inside the quarry and less intrusive.</p> <p>TB reported on the overall plantings that are going on in the region and complemented the Quarry for ensuring a high survival rate of past plantings over the very difficult summer. Further greening work is progressing on the Fernleigh and Offset Block sites.</p> <p>The presence of black cockatoos was discussed. TB made the point that the threatened Glossy Black Cockatoo may visit the Quarry area because of the large number of Allocasuarinas pre-existing and planted and recent sightings on nearby Mt Jerrabomberra. This cockatoo is listed in NSW as a Vulnerable species. It was suggested that advice could be sought from the Botanist who has done survey work for the Quarry, Isabella Crawford, to look for signs of its presence (eg eating mess on the ground) in her next survey.</p> <p>Also, a photo could be put on noticeboard to alert staff to report any sightings (and maybe also any further sightings there of Rosenberg's Monitor, the vulnerable listed goanna.</p> <p>CL asked PH to report on weed management and some specific sites were identified and PH agreed to spray those sites urgently.</p>	PH	ASAP
