A new quarry is planned by a competitor for the Williamsdale area which will affect demand.</p> <p>All environmental monitoring is as per the consent orders and all aspects of the monitoring are to be audited in coming weeks. The next meeting of the CCC will be briefed on the findings of the audit and the reports will be available on the Quarry website.</p> <p>PH agreed to brief the committee on audits at the next meeting</p> <p>Ground water monitoring was also discussed and it was noted that the four bore holes and flows to Barracks Creek were being monitored.</p>	<p>PH</p>	<p>Next meeting</p>
<p>7.</p>	<p>Matters raised by Community Representatives</p> <p>MZ raised the matter of commercial vehicle parking at Jerrabomberra Shops. It was reported that the vehicles from the quarry regularly parked at the shops, which was great for the operators but that parking was becoming an issue. PH agreed to take the matter up with the Council.</p> <p>MZ also raised the matter of trucks exceeding the speed limit on nearby roads. PH noted that all Holcim trucks had GPS trackers and were actually controlled remotely.
