Southern Lands update

Koala Fodder Plantation

Continue slashing and weed spraying, weather permitted

Watergum and Wildcare have engaged with Danoia Tree Services to help carryout maintenance until April 2025. Danoia were over at the plantation this week, cutting between the rows of trees and trimming them back.

Police Patrols update

Holcim are continuing the Police Patrols and working with Hanson to extend the time period of the patrols, and liaising with Gold Coast City Laws Council to stagger patrols for more coverage.

There have been some reports recently to Pimpama Police of frequent activity on Friday and Saturday nights between 7pm - 1am. Sue mentioned Sunday afternoons from 5pm have also been busy.

Holcim and Hanson have decided to trial two night patrols between 6:30pm - 1:30am for July, which has been agreed with Pimpama Police, however due to safety and lighting reasons, they will only be able to patrol at the entry points. I will speak with the Gold Coast City Laws Council and ask if they can carry out their patrols on Sunday afternoons for the month of July to try to get the best coverage for the busiest periods reported.

Sue mentioned she applied for some funding sometime in February this year to rehabilitate the area around the Ormeau Bottle Trees, but hasn't received any response yet.

Everyone commented on more sightings of different bird species and snakes around lately. Sue mentioned a few koala sightings on Cliff Barron Road. Campbell said he had seen platypus and fish in the Pimpama River last year before the flooding.

Heather made a comment about seeing dust in the Ormeau area from Jacobs Well, particularly on weekends. She wasn't sure if it was from Holcim's site, but said the Westerly winds may be a factor with dust from the Ormeau with other sites around.

Aunty Robyn suggested that Holcim engage in an Indigenous consultant to carry out a check of Aboriginal artefacts on Holcim's land since the flooding and removal of the trees at the back of the workshop.
