Meeting open and general business	General business - Welcome to Country - Apologies and introductions - General business Auntie Robyn delivered the Welcome to Country. Campbell, Sue, and Heather extend their apologies for being unable to attend the meeting. The Terms of Reference for the CCC and SLSG were distributed during the meeting. Southern Lands update	Police Patrols update Holcim are continuing the Police Patrols and working with Hanson to extend the time period of the patrols, and liaising with Gold Coast City Laws Council to stagger patrols for more coverage. The gate at Cliff Barron's has been destroyed, and the Upper Ormeau Road gate has been damaged. Evidence suggests that 4WDs and bikes are using the tracks, gaining access through both Cliff Barron's and Upper Ormeau Road. Additionally, a large number of tyres have been dumped on either side of Cliff Barron's Road, approximately halfway down. Police recently moved on four 4WDs that were camping on the gazetted road, with their number plates taped over to evade Council cameras. 6 patrols from 2nd January 25 - 15th March 25: 2nd January (Thursday) - 21 Street checks 17th January (Friday) - 13 Street checks 27th January (Monday) - 20 Street checks

	9th February (Sunday) - 17 Street checks 28th February (Friday) - 17 Street checks 15th March (Saturday) - 17 Street checks Traffic infringements issued: 6 x Warnings for trespass within immediate area 119 Patrols & 2084 Street checks done to date Next patrol scheduled: Sunday 30th March 2025 Koala Fodder Plantation We are in the final month to utilise the funds granted to Watgum and Wildcare for fodder farms in the area. With the remaining funds, we are working to plant an additional 500 trees and maintain the already established ones. Holcim will coordinate with Watgum for ongoing maintenance, utilising their preferred suppliers, D'Anoia Tree Services and Landcare. Landcare Sue successfully secured funding through the QLD Government Threatened Species Recovery Action Grants, which she applied for last year in collaboration with Landcare. The grant aims to protect and support the recovery of Queensland's threatened flora and fauna species in their natural habitat, with Landcare focusing specifically on the Ormeau Bottle Tree. As part of the project, Landcare plans to conduct weed control and revegetation efforts around the Ormeau Bottle Trees, monitor their growth, and collect genetic samples from trees located on Holcim land. Landcare intends to begin weed control in the Southern Lands soon, pending Council approval and access arrangements, including a key for entry. Council Road Local schools previously used Cliff Barons and Norbury Road for Kokoda Trail training but since the road closures are being moved on by Police during patrols. Sue has contacted members of Mark Hammel's office to request written permission for local schools to continue using these roads for training.

Karina shared that Waylene Currie approved the contract this week, and it has been sent to the legal team for review and final approval before moving forward with the artwork draft
