Holcim have given Council all the relevant information that was requested and are waiting on a response.

Slip update

Drillers are on site at the moment. The plan is to backfill the top 20 metres or so, and we will be monitoring changes using geotechnical monitoring instruments.

Quarry development

We have removed some trees behind the workshop, which is compliant within our disturbance limitations. At this stage there are no long term plans for this space, the short term plans potentially are for stockpiles.

We have plans to have the tyres in the area removed and possibly put some bund walls up and planting some trees, to help make it a bit more aesthetically appealing.

Environmental monitoring

- All dust monitoring results from May 2024 to August 2024 were compliant with consent conditions
- All blast monitoring results from June 2024 August 2024 were compliant with consent conditions
- 4 blasts were completed between the 25.6.24 27.8.24
- Next blast 8th October 2024

Southern Lands update

Koala Fodder Plantation

Continue slashing and weed spraying, weather permitted.

Watergum and Wildcare successfully received a grant (late June) to help pay for some maintenance costs until April 2025.

This funding goes towards all fodder farms in the area, which is 6 locations. The budget is not huge but it will allow some funding for maintenance every two months.

Danoia Tree Services is their preferred contractor, and there is a different arrangement for each fodder plantation based on the land holder preferences and budgets.

Danoia were over at the plantation last week, cutting between the rows of trees and

trimming them back.

- Paddock slashed (Ongoing)
- Propagation of trees (Ongoing)
- Weed spraying (Ongoing)
- Plantation project with Landcare has now been completed with a total of 5324 trees
