Item	Discussion Point
1.	Welcome and introductions <ul style="list-style-type: none">» The meeting commenced at 4:36pm.» Brendan Blakeley welcomed all participants and introduced himself as the group's independent Chair.» The Chair acknowledged that only one CCC community representative was present and introduced Chris from Holcim.» Therefore, the meeting would be an overview of the development application and EIS timeline, followed by questions.
2.	DA and EIS timing <ul style="list-style-type: none">» Luke outlined the project timeline.<ul style="list-style-type: none">> The project timeline remains unchanged from the previous CCC meeting. Refer to page 6 of the presentation.» Luke outlined the determination process for both the EIS and development application.<ul style="list-style-type: none">> Currently both the DA and EIS are on exhibition until 8 March. The response to submissions report will contain Holcim's response to each submission that will be provided to DPIE for review.> There are two possible pathways that the determination process may follow. The most likely pathway is for DPIE to determine the project. In an unlikely scenario, the project may be referred to be determined by the IPC.> If the proponent receives more than 50 submissions, the project determination will be referred to the IPC. This determination process will most likely mean that approval would not occur until 2022.» Luke noted he believes Holcim have submitted a strong application and fully assessed all possible impacts.
3.	General Discussion <ul style="list-style-type: none">» The Chair asked the only member present if their school had looked through the documentation yet.

CCC member: confirmed that the school will be looking at the documentation soon. She noted the one issue the school is concerned about is traffic management.

- » The Chair asked if Holcim could give some high-level guidance around traffic management.
- » Luke confirmed that Holcim have been looking into measures to reduce traffic impacts.
 - > Holcim will reduce truck movements during peak periods.
 - > Additional SIDRA modelling will be included in the response to submissions report.

CCC member: commented that Boundary Road is not equipped to support additional traffic as a result of Sheridan Road upgrades.

- » Luke agreed that there will be traffic changes to existing roads, particularly as residential developments take place. There are several options that can be investigated to mitigate traffic impacts such as utilising the potential of the Ring Road.

CCC member: stated that the new principal had noted the current traffic levels and has contacted the Council.

- » Luke expressed his understanding of the difficulty of the situation for the school.
- » Holcim will be enforcing traffic impact rules for drivers to abide by during peak periods.
- » The Chair called for questions

No questions were noted.

- » Luke noted that if anyone at the school or otherwise had any concerns about the documentation available on the site, to please contact him or Brendan.

CCC member: noted that they never feel the impacts of any of the activities carried out at the quarry such as setting of dynamite.

CCC member: explained that there is a new school in close proximity that caters for children with behavioural issues. It is a small vocational school that has recently opened in 2021.




